

Who is UNICOR?

UNICOR, the trade name for the Federal Prison Industries, Inc., is a wholly owned government corporation established in 1934 as part of the federal prison system. Its primary mission is to train, educate, and employ inmates through the production of a diverse line of products and services for sale to federal agencies at competitive prices.

This brochure evaluates UNICOR's line of ergonomic chairs and offers guidance on ordering from outside sources should UNICOR not be able to provide for your needs. It is designed to help managers and supervisors find the best chairs for themselves and their employees.

Currently, there are no restrictions on using the term "ergonomically designed" to describe chairs or any other type of office furniture. Therefore, you must pay attention to the claims made by chair manufacturers. The chair is the most intimate piece of equipment the office worker has, yet it is often overlooked in the design of a workstation.

Chairs for Special Needs

Managers can take active steps to customize the work environment and help to alleviate discomfort for those employees who experience musculoskeletal pain, work in "special" environments, or are larger or smaller than the "average" person.

Some vendors offer chairs that are specifically designed for small, medium, or large frames. Additional features might include prominently contoured seatpans to allow maximum body surface contact with minimum pressure, adjustable neckrolls, and seatpans and back supports that vibrate. Some specialized

armrests have more than the usual number of adjustments and are often longer, wider, and softer. Many chairs offer air bladders that allow the lumbar support to be adapted to fit the specific curvature of an individual's back.

If due to technical differences, you must provide a comparison.

- **Justification.** An explanation as to why UNICOR products do not meet your needs.
- **Price and quantity.** Estimated unit price and number for each item. If systems furniture, be certain to specify the number and cost of completed workstations. If request is for component parts only, please specify.
- **Realistic delivery date.** Delivery requirements inconsistent with those referenced on the General Services Administration Federal Supply Schedule require written certification from your contracting officer. This certification must state that the items are available from the outside source within the required time frame indicated in the waiver request. You must specify the delivery date as the month, day, and year that the product is needed.

Chair Classification

To help office managers select the most appropriate furniture for the office, designated categories of chairs (based on features) are listed in the box below.

Category I, Seated Work in Excess of 4 Hours Daily:

All features essential to a multi-tasked office

- Seat height adjustment accessible from seated position.
- Seat back height changed with ease; no latch needed.
- Seat pan depth adjusts for long and short legs.
- Contoured seat with waterfall front made of firm foam encased in comfortable, breathable fabric.
- Seat angle and back support move independently and lock into position selected by the user.
- Chair rotates 360 degrees.
- Passive lumbar support provided.
- Armrests easily controlled horizontally and vertically from seated position using paddle or swivel.
- Adjustments clearly labeled and easily accessed while seated.
- Five casters roll easily over carpeted surfaces.

Category II, Seated Work Less Than 4 Hours Daily:

Minimally acceptable design for office work

- Seat height and depth adjustments accessible from seated position.
- Back support tilts.
- Armrests adjust vertically.
- Seat has waterfall front and rotates 360 degrees.

- Padded with Enersorb® “memory foam” that conforms to the user’s weight & shape.
- Lumbar support automatically adjusts according to the pressure applied to the seat back.
- Spring lock paddles control adjustable pneumatic seat height, forward tilt lock, & free-float lock.
- Adjustable seat height has a unique mechanism to adjust the height without using a latch.
- Armrests adjust vertically via a numbered dial on either side; in & out via a lever.

*Options: Sled legs as a stool with adjustable 10” height or at a fixed height/position.**

- Armrests adjust vertically via a numbered dial on either side; in & out via a knob located under the seat.

Options: A stool with adjustable 10” height or at a fixed height/position. Deluxe chair features an extra wide seating area, forward tilt option, infinite position tilt lock, adjustable arms, and built-in lumbar support.*

Category II

Diva I & II \$415-475

- Diva I arm chair
- Diva I task chair
- Diva II arm chair
- Diva II task chair

Fair to Good

- Padded with fabricated foam cushions.
- Fixed lumbar support, tilt tension, & seat depth automatically adjust according to the pressure applied to the seat back.
- Button switches, similar to automobile seat switches, manipulate a hidden cable network to control the up-and-down, free-float, & forward-lock movements.

Options: Seat height, armrests, tilt tension, & seat depth are all fixed.

Note: Diva I is slightly larger than Diva II.

Tempo \$135-215

- LB arm chair
- LB chair w/out arms
- HB arm chair
- HB chair w/out arms

Fair

- Padded with fabricated foam cushions.
- Armrests are adjustable four ways.
- Lumbar support is fixed, & the overall shape is minimal.
- Seat height, back depth, & swivel are adjustable.

Options: High-back model available with tilt lock and tension control; arms and stool base also available. Drafting stool available.

LB = low back; MB = medium back; HB = high back.
