SUBJECT: Military Duty Uniform Policy – Policy Memorandum #14

1. References:

a. Army Regulation 670-1, Wear and Appearance of Army Uniforms and Insignia, 1 July 2002.


b. Memorandum, SBCCOM, AMSSB-IC, 14 Feb 2002, subject: Proper Wear of Military Uniforms.

2. The duty uniform is the Battle Dress Uniform (BDU) unless your specific duties require the wear of another uniform (Class A, Class B, laboratory coat, etc) or if stated otherwise on the training schedule. The BDU will be worn with the sleeves up in June, July, and August. During the transitional months of May and September, soldiers may choose to wear the sleeves up or down. The uniform for formations will be announced seasonally. Uniforms will be properly fitted, clean, serviceable, and pressed. Boots will be clean and shined.

3. In accordance with ref b, the BDU is not authorized for wear off the installation unless one of the following conditions apply:

- a. You are commuting between APG and your residence.
- b. You are going to restaurants for lunch.
- c. You are going to retailers for local purchase items needed for official military business.
- d. You are stopping at a convenience store for gas or home necessities.

4. Each of us as soldiers must take pride in our appearance at all times. I charge each Officer and NCO within the Command the responsibility of ensuring that soldiers take pride in their uniform and project a professional, soldierly appearance at all times.
